- ☐ The Nile is a river in Africa. It is the longest river in the world.
- ☐ The Amazon is a river in South America. It flows through the rain forest.
- ☐ The longest river in Asia is the Yangtze in China.
- ☐ The longest river in Europe is the Volga in Russia.
- ☐ The Mississippi-Missouri is the longest river in North America.
- ☐ The River Thames flows through London. It is the second longest river in the UK.
- ☐ The longest river in the UK is the Severn, which flows through and Wales and England.





- ☐ Floods can be caused by heavy rain or tidal surges.
- ☐ Rivers can burst their banks and flood the surrounding land.
- ☐ London is protected from flooding by the Thames Barrier which is made of ten steel gates and can be open and closed.
- ☐ It was built in 1982 at Woolwich in East London.

- ☐ Continent: a large land mass, sometimes containing more than one country.
- Source: the start of a river.
- ☐ **Tributary:** a small river leading into a larger one.
- ☐ **Mouth:** where the river opens into the sea.
- ☐ **Precipitation:** rain, hail, sleet or snow.
- ☐ **Floodplain:** the land beside a river which becomes flooded easily.
- ☐ **Tidal:** related to the sea's tides.
- ☐ **Fluvial:** related to the movement of the water in a river.
- $\hfill \square$ Surge: a sudden powerful rush (of water).
