- Create a spider diagram with all the facts you already know about this person and adjectives you would use to describe them

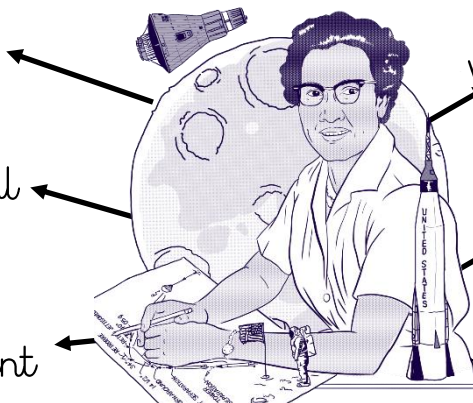
