




Born in France in 1882, Braque was a major 20th century painter known for his role in developing Cubism. Using limited colour palettes, collaged elements and shifting points of view; looking at an artwork of his could become very confusing! For this activity you will need:

2 x Plain paper, colouring pencils, scissors and glue (flour and water if you don't have glue)



by doing our best drawing of a violin before we break it all up!





shapes and lines you can see; aren't they beautiful...

ightarrow Don't forget to draw the bow too and as a bonus, you could add some musical notes as well if you like!





Now to pick our lim- \rightarrow With one of your ited colour palette! Pick two colours to use alongside your plain pencil.

colours, apply shading to the violin.

ightarrow With your second colour, shade around the outside of the violin.

 \rightarrow To add extra details, why not imagine where the violin could be in your home.

If you really love your drawing right now stop there, we're going to be cutting ours up and rearranging it... → Using your scissors carefully cut your lovely drawing in straight lines from all directions. Right through the violin and everything else!

When you've got lots of shapes, place your second piece of paper down and start to rearrange all your cut-outs on your paper. → When you're happy with your new and cool cubist arrangement, stick it down...
