 - has a subject
 - has a verb
 - begins with a conjunction
 - answers the questions why, when or how.

The lights went out because a tree had fallen on the power line.

The light went out after we had gone to bed.

The lights go out every time we have lightning.

An adverb clause can come at the beginning of a sentence.

It is separated from the main clause by a comma.

Because a tree had fallen on the power line, the lights went out.

After we had gone to bed, the lights went out.

Every time we have lightning, the lights go out.
