Gymnastics - improving outcomes for all pupils including YN	Gymnastics is 1/3 part of the school's PE curriculum. Provides teachers with the opportunity to learn alongside the coach and to accelerate children who have a natural aptitude for gymnastics. The teaching is progressive, following the BAGA scheme of work. Each year group builds on prior knowledge and assessed on a half termly basis. Children who have been identified with a natural ability, can be extended	£5000 - 2 terms of 1 to 1 coaching for all teachers in Autumn term and 6 teachers in Summer term.	All teachers across EYFS, KS1 and 2 were coached by our specialist gymnastics teachers enabling them to deliver high quality lessons independently. There have been improvements in strength, balance and mobility in all year groups as proven by the school's success in Southwark wide gymnastics and sports tournaments.
Contemporary dance	Dance - this has developed from previous years. We have seen children grow significantly in confidence in moving alone with control and with others. We also wanted an approach which would transfer with agility to online learning during any unplanned lockdowns.	1 day per week of contemporary dance teacher. £5000 (contribution to total cost)	Contemporary dance is now a central part of our KS1/2 PE provision; children have the confidence and skills to perform both for their peers and external audiences. As a result of the success of the above, we have introduced Street Dance classes led by a specialist teacher. This has enabled us to extend the provision to EYFS.

Competition Participation	In 2021/22 the school missed out on fixtures and competitions for pupils in all year groups due to Covid-19. Training and development is ongoing to improve skills and confidence when teaching PE. Bacon's sports partnership will provide training in teaching learning and assessment of PE.	Bacon's sports partnership programme of training and assessment: £1200 contribution	Through the Bacon's Sports Partnership we entered all available competitions. Coaches from Bacon's delivered monthly sessions to all year groups. Both children and the PE lead gained greater expertise in fundamental skills including catching, striking, throwing and teamwork. Children were able to perform with confidence in external tournaments.
