VOCABULARY

Egg – a round object laid by a female bird, invertebrate, fish or reptile.

Shell – the hard, protective outer case of an egg.

Yolk – the yellow part inside a chicken's egg which feeds the growing chick before it hatches.

Lifecycle – the stages a living thing goes through during its life.

Chick – a baby bird
