Born in 1906, Vasarely is a Hungarian-French artist who is considered the grandfather of 'Op Art.' Short for Optical Art which uses optical illusions. When you look at his paintings its easy to get lost, see things move or even warp into a new world!

For this activity you will need:

Plain paper, pencil, scissors, water colour paints, paint brush and a pot of water.



Lets first make our
paper into a square.

Make sure you have
your scissors ready

Take one corner of
your paper and fold
it without pressing
down, so it touches

your paper and fold it without pressing down, so it touches the other side of the paper and looks like a triangle.


Now hold the corner with one hand!

You see that
rectangle on the
side, we're going to
cut that off!


Now let go and you should have a square It doesn't need to be perfect!











Final Outcome:




Using the same techniques, here's what else you could make:
