The Palais Garnier **is** a  
1,979-seat opera house,  
which **was built** from 1861  
to 1875 for the Paris  
Opera.

It **was called** the Salle des  
Capucines, because of its location  
on the Boulevard des  
Capucines in the 9th  
arrondissement of Paris, but soon  
**became known** as the Palais  
Garnier, in recognition of its  
opulence and its architect, Charles  
Garnier.

It **was made** famous in the novel  
The phantom of the Opera by  
Gaston Leroux in 1911, then in  
the musical in 1986.

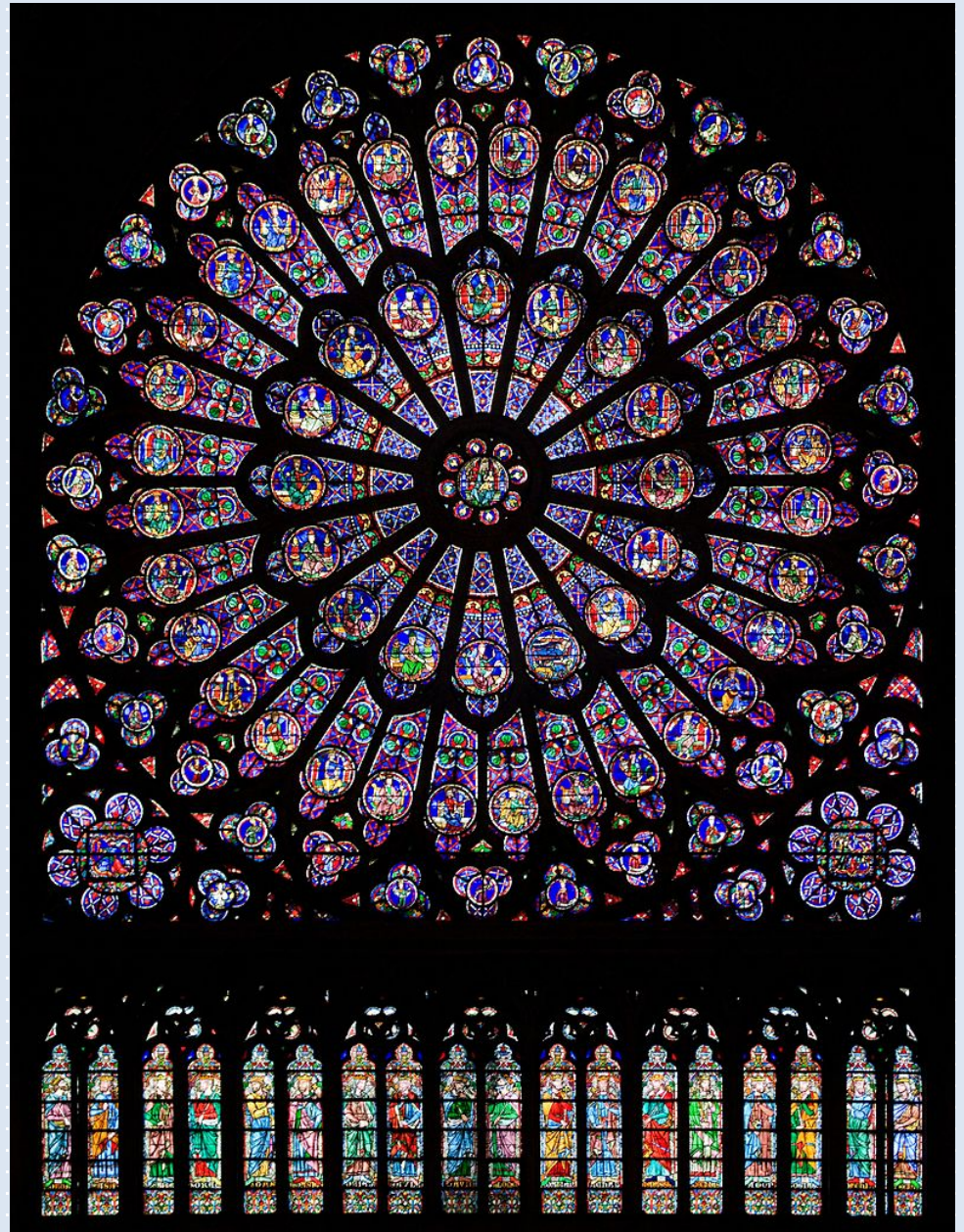
Notre Dame de Paris, which **means** “Our Lady of Paris”, **is** a medieval Catholic cathedral on the Île de la Cité in the fourth arrondissement of Paris.



The cathedral's construction **began** in 1160 and largely **completed** by 1260, though it was **modified** frequently in the following centuries.

windows.

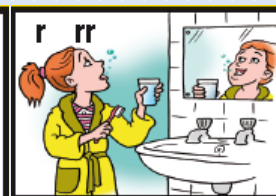
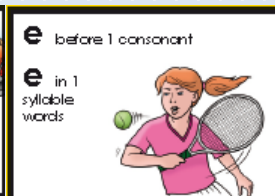
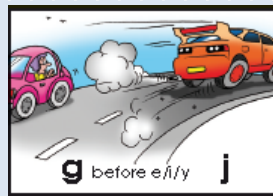
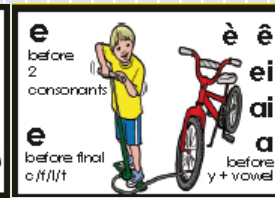
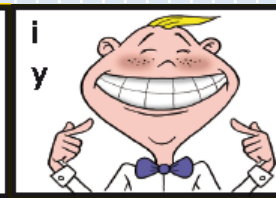
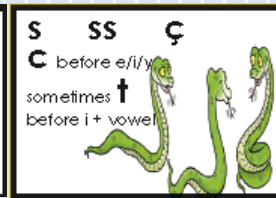
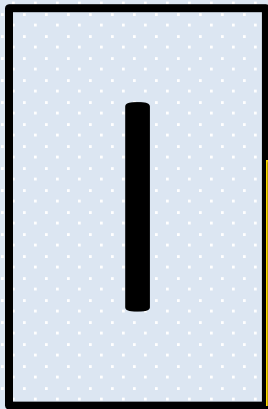

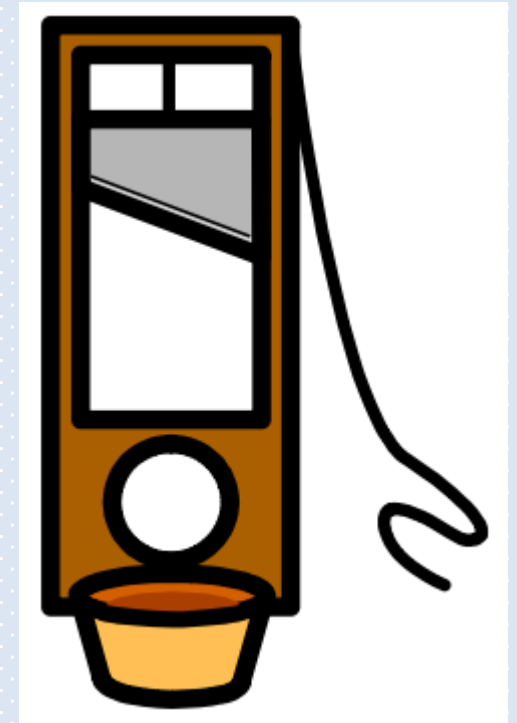


La conciergerie **is** a building in Paris, **located** on the west of the Île de la Cité (literally "Island of the City"), formerly a prison but presently **used** mostly for law courts.



It **was** part of the former royal palace, the Palais de la Cité, which **consisted** of the Conciergerie, and other buildings.

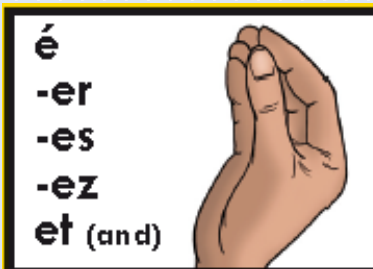
Hundreds of prisoners during the French Revolution **were taken** from the Conciergerie to be **executed** by guillotine at a number of locations around Paris.

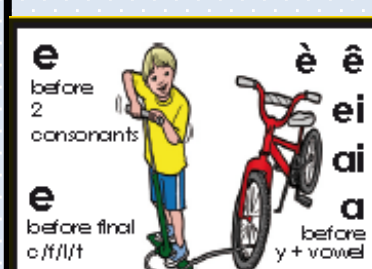


# la Tour Eiffel

You **can find** the Eiffel Tower on the Champ de Mars in Paris. It **is named** after the engineer Gustave Eiffel, whose company designed and **built** the tower.

The Eiffel Tower **was built** for the 1889 Paris Exposition and **was not intended to be** permanent. The Eiffel Tower **was going to be demolished** in 1909, but **was saved** because it **was repurposed** as a giant radio antenna.



The Eiffel Tower **is** the most **visited paid** monument in the world: 6.98 million people in 2011.

The tower **is** 324 metres (1,063 ft) tall, about the same height as an 81-storey building, and the tallest structure in Paris.

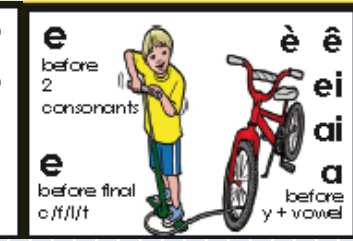
1,665 steps **are needed** to **climb** all the way to the top of the Eiffel Tower.

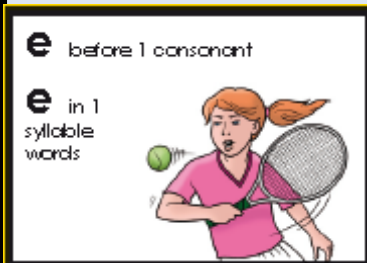

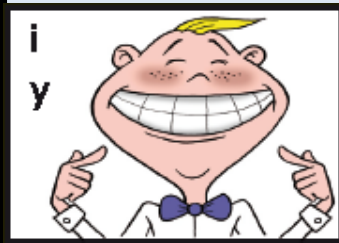

The hôtel de ville **is** in the 4<sup>th</sup> arrondissement. The south wing **was** originally **constructed** by François premier (the first) beginning in 1535 until 1551.

The north wing **was built** by Henry IV and Louis XIII between 1605 and 1628. It **was burned** by the Paris Commune (**was** a radical socialist and revolutionary government that **ruled** Paris from 18 March to 28 May 1871.), along with all the city archives that it **contained**, during the Commune's final days in May 1871.





The hôtel de ville **serves** multiple functions,  
**housing** the local administration (since  
1357), the Mayor of Paris (since 1977), and  
also **serves** as a venue for large receptions.

The Louvre **is** the world's largest art museum and a historic monument in Paris. A central landmark of the city, it **is located** on the Right Bank of the Seine in the city's 1st arrondissement.

Approximately 38,000 objects from prehistory to the 21st century **are exhibited**. In 2017, the Louvre **was** the world's most visited art museum, **receiving** 8.1 million visitors.



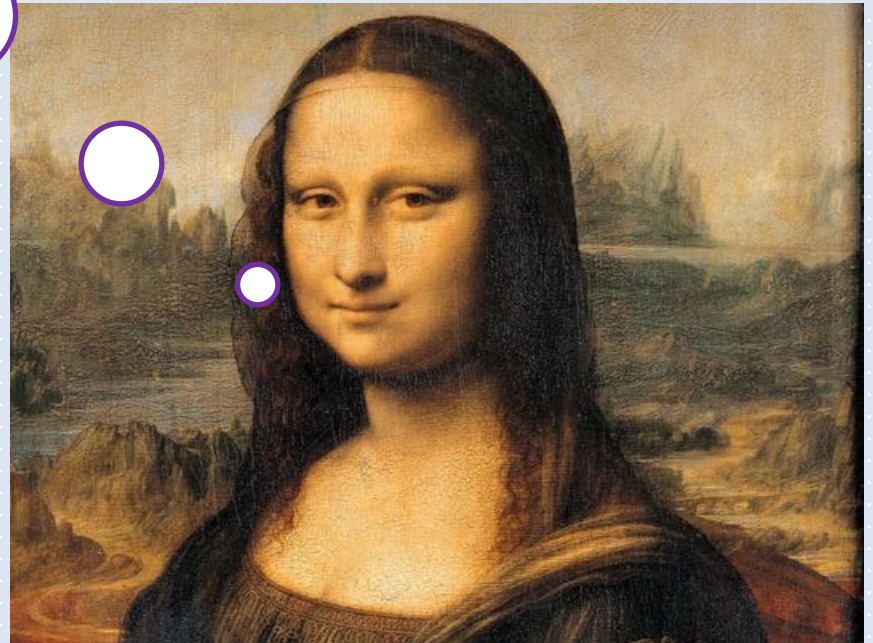


The museum **is housed** in the Louvre Palace, originally **built** as the Louvre castle in the late 12th to 13th century under Philip II.

Remnants of the fortress **are** visible in the basement of the museum. Due to the urban expansion of the city, the fortress eventually **lost** its defensive function and, in 1546, **was converted** by Francis I into the main residence of the French Kings.

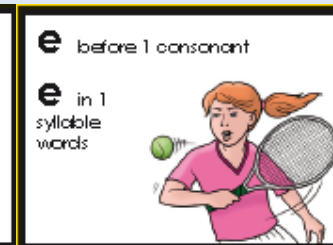
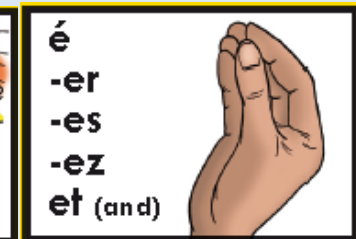
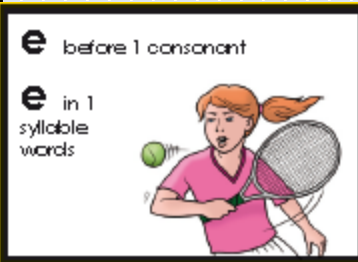
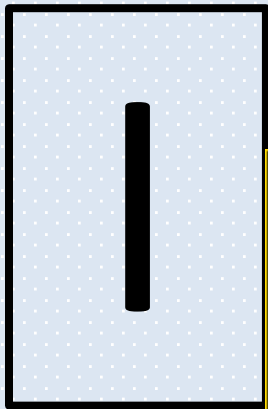

# le Sacré coeur





The Basilica of the Sacred Heart of Paris, commonly **known** as le Sacré-Coeur, **is** a Roman Catholic church and minor basilica, **dedicated** to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, in Paris.

It **is** a popular landmark and the second most **visited** monument in Paris, the basilica **is located** at the summit of the butte Montmartre, the highest point in the city.
